From the Director



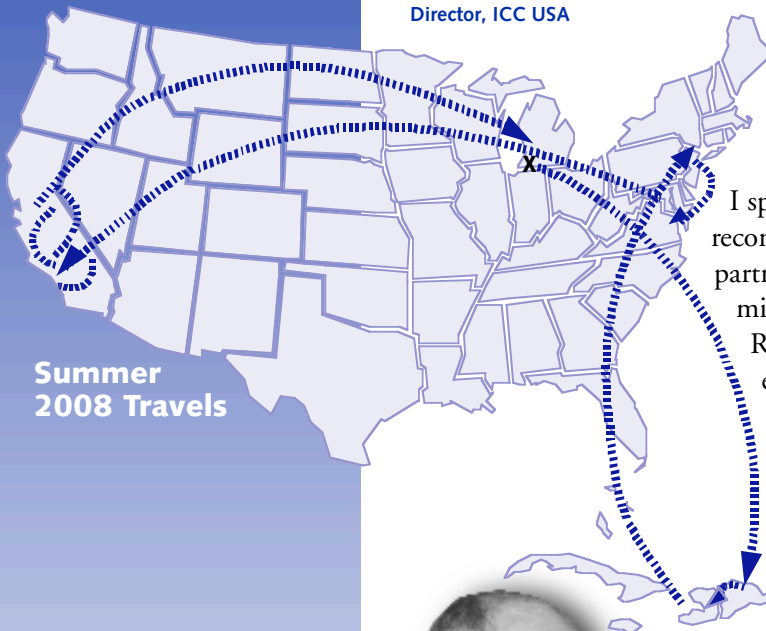

For many years we have focused the themes of Grace Newsletter on the health development programs that International Child Care operates on the island of Hispaniola. We feel it is important to keep you, our donors, up-to-date on not only the services being offered at Grace Children's Hospital, but also the various community health development and rehabilitation initiatives ICC oversees throughout Haiti and the Dominican Republic.

As always, there are many exciting things happening in the field, but there are also exciting things happening right here at home. Therefore we are dedicating this issue to updating you on some of our many important US based initiatives.

I spent much of the last few months traveling in an effort to reconnect with long-standing supporters of ICC and also forge new partnerships with individuals and churches that want to join in our ministry. My travels began with a trip to the Dominican Republic and Haiti. ICC is currently in the process of establishing a **Volunteer in Missions** program for medical professionals in partnership with the United Methodist Church. In May, a US Board Member, Dr. Jeannine Hatt, and I led a team of doctors and nurses as they conducted medical clinics in ICC program sites in the Dominican Republic. We also met with colleagues in Haiti to establish some future mobile clinic opportunities there. Our goal is to recruit medical professionals to provide much-needed hands-on medical

services in the remote regions of Northern Haiti. You can learn more about this pilot program and our May trip by checking out Dr. Jeannine Hatt's post on the [▶](#)

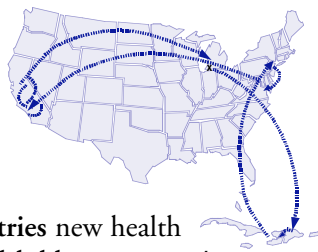


Summer 2008 Travels

In June I had the privilege of traveling to New York with Dr. Ellen Palmer – a current ICC/USA board member - to meet with Advance Special staff at the **United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR)** and key staff at the General Board of Global Ministries (GBGM). For over forty years International Child Care has been partnering with UMCOR and we currently have four Advance Special projects: Grace Children's Hospital (#418520), Integrated Community Health (#418847), Community Health Development (#410215) and Child to Child Health Promotion (#418242). The GBGM has generously offered to host our ICC/USA board meeting in January 2009.

After leaving New York Dr. Palmer and I headed to Washington D.C. to visit the US headquarters of USAID.

There we hand delivered a grant proposal for American Schools and Hospitals Abroad (ASHA) requesting funding to expand the facilities at Grace Children's Hospital. We will find out if our grant proposal was accepted around this time next year.

I also spent more than two weeks over the summer traveling around California and meeting with individuals and churches in the **California-Pacific Annual Conference (Cal-Pac)** of the United Methodist Church. This conference spans from San Diego to Los Angeles. With the help of Reverend Lynne Austin, a new recruit to the ICC/USA board, and her husband Dr. Ray Aller, I reconnected with some long-dedicated donors in this conference as well as met with numerous new potential partners. Over the course of 17 days I had the opportunity to update or present ICC to 16 churches, 4 Rotary groups, 1 Kiwanis group and various individuals. I also met with key persons at the Cal-Pac District Office for the United Methodist Church.

In addition, I had the opportunity to submit a project proposal to ExecMAP – a program of the University of Michigan's Masters of Business Administration – which was

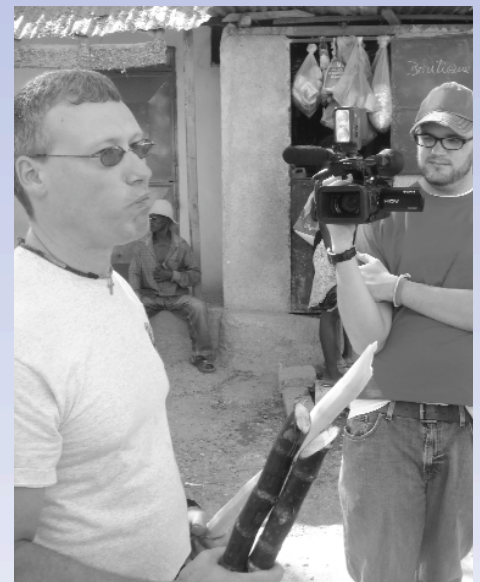
To The Ends of the Earth: *Hispaniola*

In January 2008 a group of 7 people from Portage First United Methodist Church, including local cinematographer Noah Wood, traveled to the island of Hispaniola with ICC. While visiting the Dominican Republic and Haiti, the Portage First UMC volunteers ministered to local children, visited Grace Children's Hospital, the Grace School and neighboring orphanages. The team spent time at ICC's various community health development programs and learned first-hand about the daily struggles of the Dominican and Haitian people.

This ten-day journey was captured on video and has been edited into a one hour documentary titled *To the Ends of the Earth: Hispaniola*. This is the second documentary produced by Rising Water Pictures. Rising Water Pictures, opened in 2007, was created to illuminate God at work in our world. Through documentaries and narratives, Rising Water Pictures tells powerful stories of how God's love is transforming the lives of people in developing countries.

This unique film chronicles one man's journey – Don Obermesik – as he experiences this journey with the Portage First UMC team. Obermesik is first introduced to viewers at home in Portage, Michigan. The documentary opens with Obermesik's life as a husband, father and ardent law enforcement officer in Cassopolis, Michigan. Then the real journey begins. It quickly becomes clear that Obermesik has an innate passion for mission work as he interacts with the people he meets and experiences a deep curiosity that occasionally gets the best of him. Traveling with International Child Care Obermesik encounters many less privileged than himself. A community washed away by flooding, a bizarre encounter with local police, and a hospital for gravely ill and abandoned children are just a few of the backdrops against which Obermesik's story unfolds.

From heartwarming to heart-wrenching viewers will not only see a man changed by his experiences on the island of Hispaniola, but will also see a snap shot of one man's existence as he juggles his day-to-day responsibilities, faith, and the unexpected turns that life often takes. ●

Alternative Gifts International Supports ICC's Community Based Rehabilitation Program

International Child Care's Community Based Rehabilitation Program is currently featured in Alternative Gifts International's (AGI) 2008 – 09 "My Shopping List of the World" catalog. Entitled "In-Home Rehabilitation for Disabled Children" on AGI's *shopping list*, the project will raise funds to provide weekly in-home rehabilitation visits for children with disabilities as well as train new community rehabilitation workers.



Alternative Gifts International is a nonprofit, interfaith agency. AGI provides education for people of all ages about global needs and raises funds each year in its Alternative Gift Markets and from individual donors to respond to those needs. Designated grants then are sent to the established international projects of several reputable nonprofit agencies, like International Child Care, for relief and development.

Since 2000, Alternative Gifts International has granted nearly \$128,000 to International Child Care for projects such as healthy births, vaccinations and care for children with disabilities in both Haiti and the Dominican Republic.
