#### GRACE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

- 15,377 patients were tested for tuberculosis
- 350 patients were treated for tuberculosis
- 2,211 infants were fully vaccinated

- 2,634 gynecological exams were performed
- 12,138 patients received family planning

# DOMINICAN REPUBLIC PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

#### COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION

- Rehabilitation services provided to 146 children with disabilities
- The program currently has 1 Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Coordinator, 1 CBR supervisors and 11 CBR workers
- 4,858 home visits were made by CBR workers
- Activities during a visit include: Occupational and physical therapy. Health habits, reading and writing, family days are also included.

#### COMMUNITY HEALTH DEVELOPMENT

- A total population of 14,000 people impacted by health services
- Trained promoters in RBC guidelines, human rights for people with disabilities, child abuse, autism spectrum, case study, and physical therapy.
- Provided 4 training sessions for mothers promoting physical rehabilitation for children with cerebral palsy.
- 30 meetings to review individual plans and case analysis with Community Health Care Workers
- 10 meetings to review overall process monitoring

#### SCHOOL INCLUSION

- 17 children enrolled
- 2 schools participating
